

Third Sunday in Advent ~ Gaudete Sunday

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT December 15, 2024

Reading

ZEP 3:14-18A

Are all our problems are solved! And indeed they have with the coming of Jesus! How can this be so? Are you caught up in everyday problems? Instead,,, "Shout for joy!" Shout for joy, O daughter Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel! Be glad and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The LORD has removed the judgment against you he has turned away your enemies; the King of Israel, the LORD, is in your midst, you have no further misfortune to fear. On that day, it shall be said to Jerusalem: Fear not, O Zion, be not discouraged! The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a mighty savior; he will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, he will sing joyfully because of you, as one sings at festivals. Psalm IS 12:2-3, 4, 5-6

A rare time when the Psalm is not from the book of Psalms. Again, the readings call us to "Cry out with joy!" What gift does Jesus have for us? What do we need to do to receive this gift?

Reading

PHIL 4:4-7

Paul is reminding us to "rejoice" because "The Lord is near"! What is "the peace of God that surpasses all understanding"? You see in comics the man holding the sign, "The end is near!" What 'end' is meant by the sign? Do you find it in the reading? Brothers and sisters:

Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

R. Alleluia, alleluia.

IS 61:1 The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. R. Alleluia, alleluia.

Gospel

LK 3:10-18

John the Baptist was often asked, "What should we do?" Have you asked (prayed to) Jesus this question? What answer have you received? All he asks if for faith in him and his grace will be given.

The crowds asked John the Baptist,

"What should we do?" He said to them in reply, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized and they said to him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He answered them, "Stop collecting more than what is prescribed." Soldiers also asked him, "And what is it that we should do?" He told them, "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages." Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.

God: Very good...I think that could help a lot of people find that moment that I'm talking about. Thank you for that.

Me: Well, it's not that great of a realization on my part, I mean...

God: No, no...it may not seem that great a statement to you, but to me, if each person were to find a moment to know what we are truly celebrating, that would be my reason to "Rejoice!"


