

The readings for this feast remind us that from earliest times, the people of God were anticipating the coming of a savior. Both Simeon and Anna, had spent their lives in prayer and quiet watchfulness until God should come. Anna never ceased to hope because day by day she kept her contact with God, her source of strength. The example of these two witnesses prompts us to reflect on hope and what it is that we hope for. Pope Francis has invited us during this Jubilee Year of Hope to rediscover hope in our prayer and worship and then, to bring hope and sow hope into all that our daily lives hold, because "hope does not disappoint."



to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord.

they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth.

The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom:

and the favor of God was upon him.
