



WEEKLY SCRIPTURES & THOUGHTS For the Parish Family of Saint Christine



THIRTIFIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME November 3, 2024+

Reading Dt 6:2-6

Moses tells the Chosen People to 'Fear the Lord', we too must 'Fear' Him...and love Him! Honor Him by following His commands and hold Him in our love! Moses spoke to the people, saying: "Fear the LORD, your God, and keep, throughout the days of your lives, all his statutes and commandments which I enjoin on you, and thus have long life. Hear then, Israel, and be careful to observe them, that you may grow and prosper the more, in keeping with the promise of the LORD, the God of your fathers, to give you a land flowing with milk and honey. "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength. Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today."

Psalm

Ps 18:2-3, 3-4, 47, 51

Do you see the Lord as your strength? Have you followed Him or do you(we) just keep close when it is a hard time for us? What does it mean to be 'my rock'? Do we see Him there?

Reading Heb 7:23-28

Jesus, our high priest, perfectly shows us what we should be doing...we, however, have difficulty...
Brothers and sisters:

The levitical priests were many because they were prevented by death from remaining in office, but Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away. Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he lives forever to make intercession for them. It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests, but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law, appoints a son, who has been made perfect forever.

Alleluia

R. Alleluia, alleluia. <u>Jn 14:23</u>

Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord; and my father will love him and we will come to him. R. **Alleluia**.

<u>Gospel</u> <u>Mk 12:28b-34</u>

How far are we from God's kingdom? Dare to ask Him that question and listen for the response! One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."

And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him,

"You are not far from the kingdom of God."
And no one dared to ask him any more questions.

Some Thoughts...As we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, our Lectionary skips a chapter that helps set the context for today's reading. If we were to read the sections skipped (chapter 11 and part of chapter 12), we would hear about Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, his cleansing of the Temple, and the questioning of Jesus' authority by the chief priests, scribes, and elders. The context, therefore, for this Gospel is Jesus' growing exposure before the Jewish authorities. Jesus is being questioned and tested by the Jewish authorities, yet the scribe who addresses Jesus in today's Gospel seems to be an admirer; he is not testing Jesus.

The question posed in today's Gospel requires Jesus to interpret the Law of Moses. The Mosaic Law consists of the Ten Commandments and many additional commandments, numbering into the hundreds. For a devout Jew, adherence to the Mosaic Law is an expression of faithfulness to God's covenant with Israel. The ranking of these commandments was regularly debated among the teachers of the Law.

Jesus was not the only Jewish religious teacher to connect these two commandments, love of God and love of neighbor. Both of these commandments were central elements of the religious tradition that Jesus learned from his Jewish community. Indeed, these commandments continue to be central aspects of contemporary Jewish religious understanding. Jesus' response to his questioners proposed an integral connection between these two aspects of the Jewish Law. Love of God finds its expression in our love for our neighbor. Many believe, however, that this connection was heard in a new and fresh way when spoken by Jesus.

The scribe who questions Jesus in today's Gospel engages in a positive dialogue with Jesus. He agrees with Jesus' teaching that the commandments to love God and love neighbor stand above the commandment to offer worship and sacrifice in the Temple. With this dialogue, Jesus appears to close the debate with the Jewish authorities. Mark reports that no one dared to question Jesus further.

Me: And it is always good to see you and talk with you.

God: Thank you - I love hearing that. And I *do* feel the same way about you.

Me: That makes me feel so good. I know in today's Gospel and in the other readings too, it was all about loving YOU. I know how important that is.

God: So tell me. You know how important that is because you heard it today in the Liturgy of the Word or because you just know it?

Me: A little bit of both, I guess. I mean I do know I am suppose to love you.

God: Suppose to love? Or that you just do love me?

Me: Yeah, well I get the difference. I do. And I guess I used to love you as an obligation kind of thing but I've learned, I've felt more comfortable over the time we have spent together just realizing more and more that I just simply love you. Does that make sense?

God: More than you can ever realize. That means a lot to me.

Me: Well, can I make one other thing clear?

God: Please do.

Me: After your Son said the "love you stuff", then he really made it hard with all the love one another stuff?

God: Ah, there is the greater challenge, eh?

Me: Oh, you don't know how hard it is.

God: Of curse I know. But I would not ask it of you if it wasn't important and what has to be done for you all to live according to my will.

Me: But some of us are so hard to love and ...

God: You think I don't know that about you? Many of you?

Me: Well, I know. I know. But we sure do make it hard on ourselves.

God: YES!! YOU DO!

Me: We'll try or at least I can say that I will try harder.

God: Thank you. That's a start. C'mon, hot chocolate time.


