Sunday in Ordinary Time Twenty-sixth Today's Gospel is a lesson in tolerance, and one that many of us need to learn. We hear the apostle John wanting to silence someone who is not "one of us." #### <u>Nm 11:25-29</u>

Put yourself in Moses company with the Lord. Do you have a Joshua in your life to doubt your being touched by the Holy Spirit?

The LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to Moses. Taking some of the spirit that was on Moses, the LORD bestowed it on the seventy elders; and as the spirit came to rest on them, they prophesied. Now two men, one named Eldad and the other Medad, were not in the gathering but had been left in the camp. 
